

Yuan Ze University Regulations Governing the University Bachelor Program

Approved at the 6th Academic Affairs Meeting of Academic Year 2025-2026 on March 11, 2026

1. To assist students in pursuing flexible and interdisciplinary studies across colleges and academic fields based on their individual interests and career aspirations, and to cultivate talents with interdisciplinary integration capabilities, Yuan Ze University (hereinafter referred to as "the University") hereby establishes the Yuan Ze University Regulations Governing the University Bachelor Program (hereinafter referred to as "the Regulations").

2. The term University Bachelor Program as referred to in these Regulations means a bachelor's degree conferred by the University upon students who have completed the prescribed coursework and credit requirements established by the University.

The University Bachelor Program aims to cultivate interdisciplinary professionals. Its core development areas include Artificial Intelligence, Semiconductors, Innovation and Regional Revitalization, and Sustainable Development. °

3. Undergraduate students of the University may apply for admission to the University Bachelor Program after completing one semester of study (the second semester of the first academic year) and before the end of their second academic year. Applications shall be submitted within the designated application period announced in the academic calendar.

Students admitted to the Program shall pursue their studies under the University Bachelor framework while retaining their original departmental enrollment status.

4. The number of students admitted to the University Bachelor Program each academic year shall, in principle, not exceed two percent (2%) of the University's sophomore undergraduate student population. The actual admission quota shall be reviewed and announced by the University Bachelor Committee.

5. Students applying for the University Bachelor Program shall independently develop a learning proposal based on the University's designated development areas (Artificial Intelligence, Semiconductors, Innovation and Regional Revitalization, and Sustainable Development) or another specific interdisciplinary theme.

The learning proposal shall include the following:

- A. Learning objectives.
- B. Academic planning, including:
 - a. University-wide and college-required courses;
 - b. Credit-bearing programs (interdisciplinary programs or concentration programs);
 - c. Elective courses; and
 - d. Diverse experiential or practical learning courses.

Prior to submitting the learning proposal, students shall complete the required academic advising or exploratory requirements in accordance with the Yuan Ze University University Bachelor Program Study Regulations.

- 6. After a preliminary review by the University Bachelor Office, the learning proposal shall be submitted to the University Bachelor Committee for evaluation.

The University Bachelor Committee shall be responsible for reviewing students' learning proposals, course plans, and credit recognition, and for determining the development area to be conferred and annotated on the diploma based on each student's approved field of study.

- 7. The standards and conditions for recognizing and substituting inter-college courses required by the University Bachelor Program shall be separately prescribed in the Yuan Ze University University Bachelor Program Study Regulations.

The composition and operation of the University Bachelor Committee shall be separately governed by the Yuan Ze University University Bachelor Committee Establishment Guidelines.

- 8. Courses taken under the University Bachelor Program that are identical to courses required by a student's original department shall not be counted repeatedly toward graduation credits.

- 9. The graduation qualifications of students enrolled in the University Bachelor Program shall be reviewed and approved by the University Bachelor Committee and then forwarded to the Office of Academic Affairs for the issuance of diplomas.

Students who meet the graduation requirements shall be awarded the degree of Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies, and the completed development area may be annotated on the degree certificate.

- 10. Should the University Bachelor Program be terminated for any reason, an explanatory

report shall be submitted and publicly announced one academic year prior to termination. The termination shall take effect only after approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting. Appropriate supporting measures shall also be established to protect the academic rights and interests of students who have enrolled in the Program but have not yet graduated.

11. Matters not specified in these Regulations shall be governed by the University's Academic Regulations and other applicable rules and regulations.
12. These Regulations shall take effect upon approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting, promulgation by the University, and submission to the Ministry of Education for recordation. The same procedure shall apply to any amendments.
